WHAT KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS DID YOU ACHIEVE IN THE PAST YEAR?

In 2018 we celebrated with Rev. President Jules Mboka the signing of our official Memorandum of Understanding with the Covenant Church of Congo (CEUM). What a joy to work together as partners in facilitating effective, gospel focused projects with the people of northwest DR Congo!

Partnering closely with medical leaders in the CEUM is paramount to progress in the Hospital Initiative and the Congo Clinic Initiative. Results in medical development are numerous; however, it is relationship building that strengthens our partnership and provides the foundation for years to come. Craig Anderson, director of medical and health programs, has catalyzed medical development through his leadership in these relationships, as well as leading through the Medical Steering Team of the PCP Medical Ambassadors.

PCP is grateful to partner with Hope International Development Agency to build bridges, and with Café Africa DRC to implement the Karawa Coffee Project. We value the commitment, expertise, and bond in faith we share with these partners who work on site in DR Congo to bring these projects to fruition.

In the United States PCP’s activities have included engaging donors to learn, pray, give, serve, and go. Bob Anderson joined the PCP team as partner engagement representative in August 2018. We are thankful for Bob’s leadership in donor relations, and for PCP’s recent financial reports which reflect a robust trajectory. Becky Dangel, marketing manager, leads in presenting PCP to donors and to the world through print, digital, and online media. Bringing PCP to life through stories, photos, videos, and relevant data glorifies God as we share of his great provision, lives saved, and communities impacted through partnership projects.

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE COVENANT CHURCH OF CONGO

- New maternity ward completed at Bogose Nubea hospital
- Nine new clean water sources completed near clinics
- Medical staff trained in essential care for newborns at Wasolo Hospital
- Medical staff trained in supply chain management at Karawa Hospital
- Loko Hospital celebrated 50 years of Covenant Church of Congo leadership.

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH HOPE INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY AND COVENANT CHURCH OF CONGO

- Three new bridges completed: Likalamo, Mbanga, Sasa

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH CAFÉ AFRICA & COVENANT CHURCH OF CONGO:

- Karawa Coffee Project successfully completed first full year: training 1,400 coffee producers in agronomy and business practices; growing 415 kilos of seed to 812,000 plants; transferring plants to 750 hectares of fields (spring 2019).

WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS FOR THE COMING YEAR?

Moving forward through 2019 and 2020, PCP anticipates the following strategic activities:

- Expanding capacity at hospitals through new construction, equipment, and training; completing 33 new clean water sources near clinics through 2020; Medical Ambassador training trips to continue “training of trainers” at three hospitals
- Completing three new bridges and developing plans to repair 12 bridges in the Bogose Nubea region
- Facilitating the first Karawa Coffee Project coffee harvest of pre-existing plants, fall 2019; and official introduction of Karawa coffee to the world
